A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR . . .

LET THE LIGHT SHINE

In the 1970s, Carol and I had a winter trip to Chicago. We took an afternoon to go to the planetarium for the seasonal show entitled "The Star of Bethlehem. A huge camera shined lights on the dome. They start with showing the faint heavenly lights, but then turn down the "light pollution" to reveal the beauty of the stars and planets. Then, they turn the cameras back 12, then 24 hours, and begin to rotate for a week, then months, then years, all the way back to the spring of the year of our calendar's 4 B.C. In the western sky, there appeared (if I remember correctly) four planets lined up not far above the horizon, giving the impression of a common "star" pointing downward. This formation was in the constellation Pisces, which is the constellation of the Jews. Given some differentiations in calendar structure over time and the thought that--for shepherds to THY WORD IS be watching their flocks by night--it might well be in that springtime that Jesus was AND A LIGHT born, and this configuration of the planets UNTO MY might well have been "the Star of

What we have in scripture is the story of the Wise Men (astrologers?) from the East traveling to see what great event was taking place among the Jews. Their travels led them to the birth place of our Lord, and their honoring with gifts befitting The New Born King. The following of the Light--the Star--is the

scripture for The Epiphany of our Lord, celebrated on January 6. It is another way of embracing Christ's Coming as a God-designed cosmic event as well as a marked event in human history.

Epiphany (from *epi* = upon/on/at plus *phanos* lamp) is for us the season in which we celebrate the Light of Christ lighting God's way into our lives, and thus also how we become lamps to shine pathways for others. The first and last Sundays of Epiphany are "Christ Sundays"--the first being the Baptism of Our Lord, and the last being The Transfiguration of Our Lord. This season flows out of our celebrating the Birth of Our Lord, and begins to elaborate on the significance for our lives and our world of the Word becoming flesh and the Light coming into our world. We might then recall an often memorized verse, Psalm 119:105: "Thy Word is a lamp unto my feet, and a Light unto my path." (KJV)

In our Transition Process, now leading us into the Call Process, we have called upon scripture to help to "enlighten" our congregational journey from our past ministry to our future ministry. We have strived to keep this spiritual dynamic present in what we think and say and do in these months. Now we also are striving to be intentional about engaging the Holy

Spirit to enlighten our paths as we plan, discuss, seek out, and decide upon a pastor to Call to serve us at Zion going forward. Show us, Lord, we pray--shine ahead the path we need to follow.






